Location, location, location - the most important factor when deciding on the specification of your dream conservatory

Why? Well, you probably already know what you want your new conservatory to be, Playroom, Breakfast Room, Dining Room, etc. However it is the location of your new conservatory that will determine what its natural characteristics will be. Take note of these characteristics then, if needed, use the available products and ancillary items to 'fine-tune' the environment to ensure that your new conservatory will be perfect for you.

North Facing

Receives sunlight most of the year, although not direct, making the conservatory warm and bright during the summer but not too hot. Lack of direct sunlight can make the conservatory colder in the winter so adequate heating and good insulation are vital. Always specify Neutral Plus 1.1 glass and, if using polycarbonate in the roof, also specify the thicker 35mm product as these will both help to keep the conservatory warm in the colder months.

West Facing

Makes the perfect Dining Room. Late afternoon and early evening sun will make this conservatory a most pleasant place to be. Fantastic sunsets for sure but can still get fairly hot in the summer, so adequate ventilation is a must.

East Facing

Simply the perfect breakfast room! Plenty of sun in the morning makes this a delightful position for any conservatory.

Summary

So, if you want to make your conservatory brighter use a clear roofing material. If you want to reduce glare be sure to specify a tint. If it's keeping warm that is the priority specify Neutral Plus 1.1 glass and/or 35mm polycarbonate. And if keeping cool in the summer is at the top of your list then you can't go wrong with either 'Heatguard' polycarbonate or 'Sunguard' glass in your roof.

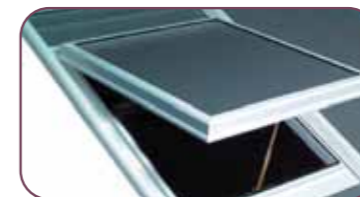

South Facing

Arguably the best position for any conservatory. Lots of sunshine all day, all year (British weather permitting!). Adequate ventilation and shade are essential to ensure that your conservatory does not become uncomfortable in the hot summer months. Opening vents in the roof are fast becoming a must in South facing conservatories to allow a quick escape for the rising hot air.

Glare can also be a problem so if using glass in the roof be sure to specify 'Sunguard'. This revolutionary product reduces glare and reflects heat, allowing you to enjoy your conservatory in total comfort for much more of the year than was ever possible before. If polycarbonate is the roof glazing material of your choice then be sure to specify a heat-reflective product, such as 'Heatguard', which can keep your conservatory up to 50% cooler in the hottest of months.

Ancillaries. The perfect finishing touches to your new room. Practical, decorative or both, they really can make all the difference.



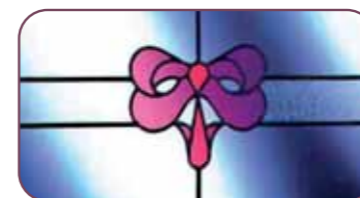
Roof Vents
